BFS 6<sup>th</sup> Form consultation

When the idea of setting up a new school was first conceived by the parents' action group, Parents' Voice, some four years ago, the intention was to set up and start an 11-19 school with a sixth form as an integral part. When a new government and the introduction of the 'Free Schools' programme made this possible it was decided, given the complexities of being a trail blazer, to focus on establishing an excellent 11 – 16 school and then to add a sixth form at a later date. The time to begin the process of adding the sixth form has arrived.

Bristol Free School has been a resounding success and we have just taken in our third group of students and moved into our purpose built accommodation. We were one of a small number of secondary schools in Bristol which was over-subscribed with first choice applicants for entry this September and we recently had our first excellent Ofsted inspection. Year 9, our first year group of students will take their GCSE examinations in the summer of 2016 and we believe that many students and their parents will want to have the opportunity to continue their education in the School's own sixth form. It is worth noting that when the Trust leased our school site from the Department for Education (DfE), the large empty block alongside the main school building was included in the lease to provide a cost effective solution to adding a sixth form.

We will be consulting the parents of students currently at Bristol Free School, parents with children at local primary schools and other interested parties, including the Local Authority, secondary schools and colleges about this proposal. If after consultation the governing trust decides to pursue this option, they will make a formal application to the DfE and seek the capital funding to equip the necessary additional accommodation.
