


BRISTOL Weekly Update

A cold and cloudy evening told a story of its own, winter was near. BFS turned up with a powerful line up knowing that we will be challenged by some ferocious opposition.


Our first game against Oasis started even with some solid tackles from both sides. But we were caught flat footed and Oasis nicked a try with some nice play.
