Words from the Headteacher

I hope you've all had a restful break and are finally enjoying a little respite in the weather. During the February break Bristol Free School ran its first overseas trip, to the Italian ski resort of Claviere. It was very successful and our students left an extremely positive impression on everyone they met, from our ski instructors to our coach drivers. These students have set the bar high in terms of expectations for all future trips, so thank you and well done. The trip was organised by Miss Furness-Smith and before her tragic death last year she was looking forward to leading the trip. Below are extracts of a letter I wrote to Miss Furness-Smith's parents following the trip and these serve to remind us of what a loss Miss Furness-Smith (Buffy) is to the School and of her legacy to the students and staff who were able to go on the skiing trip.

"...Buffy arranged for 44 students along with 7 staff to visit the Milky Way resort of Claviere. All students and staff had a wonderful time and this is in no small part to your daughter's enthusiasm and expert organisational skills to make the trip happen. The ski trip was Bristol Free School's first foray overseas and our students were fine ambassadors of the school. We paid tribute to Buffy on the trip by taking a photo of her with us which I hope you can see in the centre of the photograph, I then took the photo of Buffy to the top of red route 93 (a favourite amongst the staff that week) and left her at the top of the mountain.

When I interviewed Buffy for her job at Bristol Free School we talked about a skiing trip. I said that if she was successful in gaining the post at BFS then she'd have a very short turn around to organise and fill a ski trip. I asked her if she could do it, she looked me in the eye and with a wry smile said yes. I'm not sure who held whom to this promise but we met regularly from then on and several months later I have returned from another ski trip but this one is certainly my most satisfying; one full of, and fuelled by emotion.

It will always be a deep regret that I, together with the staff and students at Bristol Free School did not have more time with Buffy. She made an immediate impact on us all and I am certain that she would have become a fine leader in any school or organisation. Her passion for the outdoors was worn on her sleeve and I spent a fun afternoon with her

building our climbing wall before she had to rush off to meet up with friends.

As Headteacher of Bristol Free School I will always be proud of the fact that I appointed Buffy to the School and sad that I did not have longer to see her grow in to a leader of the future..."
