On Friday 28 February Bristol Free School received a visit from the Secretary of State for Education, the Rt Hon Michael Gove MP. He was accompanied by Charlotte Leslie, MP for Bristol North West. Charlotte worked closely with Parents' Voice to help set up the School prior to our opening in 2011. Mr Gove was on a whistle stop tour of Bristol and parts of Somerset and called in to BFS to see how the school had developed since he signed the funding agreement in 2011. Mr Gove and Charlotte Leslie visited a number of classrooms including a Year 7 Science practical, a Year 9 Art class which was working with clay and a Year 9 Geography class which was investigating the causes of hurricanes.

Towards the end of his visit, Mr Gove was served refreshments by four students, Megan Lloyd, Portia Neville, Matthew Taylor and Ibrahim Ibrahim on the balcony of our Sports Hall, while Miss McInnes led a PE lesson in the main hall below. These four students are members of the founding year group and have been part of the School's growth from a cohort of 80 students to a school of over 400 students and which is over subscribed for the second year running.

Mr Gove was very pleased with what he saw and spent a great deal of his time interacting with the students who enjoyed his company and discussed matters with him ranging from teaching and learning to their career aspirations.

I was honoured to be able to show Mr Gove our school and he was greatly impressed. It gave him the opportunity to see what he had helped to create and, crucially, to meet the students who have benefited from Bristol Free School becoming the first choice for parents in North West Bristol.

Thank you to everyone who helped organise the day; it was a proud moment for us all.
