

'Live below the Line' week

Next week sees Bristol Free School join millions of people around the world in raising awareness of global poverty. 'Live below the Line' is a fundraising and campaigning event which challenges people to live below the poverty line, on just £1 a day, for five days. The challenge is tough but gives a unique glimpse into the lives of 1.2 billion people who live below the poverty line every day.

Our Geography teacher, Mr Williams, is leading events in School and will be joined by other teachers in living off £1 a day for food and drink. Never one to be outdone, Mr Williams is also walking a 12 mile round trip to school each day, and sleeping on the floor at home, as well as taking cold bucket showers and living without electricity, phone or internet. The aim is to raise money for Human Care Syria, and promote awareness in School of the lives of those who live off £1 a day or less.

(vegetable broth) will be available for students to purchase from the dining hall. (The usual options will still be available.) Thursday 1 May: water carrying race – to simulate the struggles of millions who have no access to clean, safe water. Students will carry a bucket of water around an obstacle

course. Fastest time wins a prize!
Friday 2 May: £1 Cake Sale – at 3.00 pm,
students will be able to purchase two cakes
for £1 with all proceeds going to Human
Care Syria.

Jessie Neale -Easter artist

Over the Easter holidays Jessie Neale (Year 8) was asked by John Hadley, the priest at Horfield Parish Church, to design and paint the special Paschal candle. After many hours, amounting to days, practising on an old candle Jessie finished her design, which she then painted in acrylic paints.

The design included twelve sheep to represent the disciples and sacrifice, a grape vine representing the blood of Christ, bees for healing and butterflies for new life.

In a special Easter morning service at 5.00 am the Paschal candle was lit on a bonfire and paraded through the church. The candle can be seen in the church all year. If you would like to see it you can visit the church any day until about 6.00 pm.
