Monday's staff training day focused on key elements of teaching and learning, from sharpening learning objectives to GCSE curriculum planning. We gathered together in the Drama Hall and staff worked in departments to re-visit what we would expect to see in a BFS lesson. Departments then set up a teaching and learning market place/trade fair in the LRC. Each department pitched their teaching and learning tricks of the trade to the other departments in a timed carousel exercise. Mr Jones was a strict time keeper, ensuring that we all kept moving around the fair. He also organised the vote to see which department's teaching and learning ideas were deemed to be the most useful and ones which staff would use in lessons. In third place was Music, second was English and first was Art, Design, Computing and Technology (ADCT). Congratulations to all of the staff for showcasing such a useful array of resources which I look forward to seeing appear in lessons across the School. During the afternoon staff worked out of their department bases implementing these ideas into existing and new schemes of work.

Perhaps the most exciting part of the day was the opportunity it gave for our new teaching staff to join us and take their first steps in to the School since interview day. They are all fine additions to our teaching staff and are eager to become part of Bristol Free School as we become four year groups and embark on Key Stage 4. For September we will welcome: Mr Aldridge, Mrs Hill and Mr Cousins (Maths department); Miss Smith and Mr Lewis (Science department); Miss McGrath and Mr Collis (English department); Mr Keen and Mr Davies (ADCT department); Mr Bishop and Mr Parry (Humanities department); and Mr Tolman and Miss Exton (PE department).

The end of year exam season is upon us and on Monday 9 June Year 9 will sit exams in Maths and English in the LRC. The students have been briefed by staff about the logistics of the day and the experience will give them a taste of what sitting GCSEs will be like in the summer of 2016. Year 9 will be using their official candidate numbers for the first time and although this is merely an organisational tool it is a number which they will use for all public exams at BFS, as well as our internal ones. The sooner they can memorise it the better. The following Monday and Tuesday will see Years 7 and 8 sitting their English and Maths exams in the LRC. For all other subjects, for all students, exams will mainly be carried out between 30 June and 11 July and based in the normal classroom spaces.

Next up were Downend, and we were not as successful because their precise bowling threw us a bit. We managed to make 29 runs which was an easy target for the opposition. Their batting was equal to their bowling and we had to cover the boundaries in order to stop them scoring more runs. They made 54 runs and took victory.

The final game was against Abbeywood. Due to a shortage of time it was decided that this would only be a 5 over game. The opposition finished on 24-4 which we were confident we could overtake. We started brightly with our opening two bowlers taking a wicket each in their first over. Michael then secured a third wicket for BFS with a fantastic delivery, toppling Clifton High's top order. Tom Kent and George Fowler continued the pressure on their batsman, before Amaan Rashid took two wickets in two overs to leave the opponents on an achievable target of 40-5. Opening batsmen Cyrus Shafi and captain Dan eased into the game nicely and were looking comfortable, when an impressive delivery took the middle stump and gave Gabriel Lombard the opportunity to add to the BFS total. Clifton High were unable to take another wicket as Gabriel specialised in making singles and Dan hit three fours on his way to top scoring on 17 not out. BFS finished on 43-1 with an over remaining to take victory. The fielding display was excellent with Elias Fry, Josh Blackman and Robin Kirk all demonstrating control and precision in the field.
