Words from the Headteacher

Although we began study club last week and had our first 6 Degrees of Aspiration speaker take the floor of the Drama Hall on Monday, our extra-curricular programme is starting in earnest next week. Bristol Free School's extra-curricular programme is a fantastic addition to the students' taught curriculum. Not only are the clubs and activities designed to be fun and pique the interest and imagination of the students, they are a key component of our 6 Degrees of Aspiration programme. I expect every student at Bristol Free School to attend at least one extra-curricular club together with spending at least one afternoon in study club. The vast majority of clubs begin straight after the end of the taught curriculum. Students need to arrive promptly at the club's location and wait in an orderly fashion for the member of staff running the club. We keep registers of who attends but the responsibility lies with each student to let their parent/carer know which evenings they will be staying beyond 3.00 pm at school. If a student is staying for any after school activity then they are to stay on site. If a student leaves the school site at the end of the school day they should not return.
