#### Words from the Headteacher

BFS is participating in an 'active travel' school challenge. Next week members of the organisation *sustrans* are coming in to our assemblies to promote the challenge. The challenge runs from 14 to 24 October. Students at Bristol Free School can sign up for the challenge and log how they travel to school on each of the days of the challenge. The purpose of the challenge is for students to travel to school in the healthiest and most sustainable ways possible. We will also be able to see how our students' journeys compare to those of other students across the region.

Here is what *sustrans* have said:

"**The Schools Challenge** – set to run from the 14 to 24 October, to promote 'active travel' school runs. It's brand new and we are offering it to schools across the west of England. Students who register get to log their active journeys (cycling/walking/ scooting/ public transport) to school through a website in order to win prizes and take part.

- 2 prize draws a day for spot prizes (itunes vouchers, Amazon vouchers, Cinema vouchers, love2 shop vouchers)
- 1 photo prize per week (iPod nano/kindle)
- 2 'invite a friend' prize draws per week (iPod nano/kindle)
- 1 prize draw a week for those with 100% journeys logged (day out: Zoo/Go Ape/Longleat)

#### **Basic school equipment**

There are some items which should be part of the daily preparation and checking for a day at school:

- rucksack to carry books and pencil case;
- pencil case containing: pens, pencils, sharpener, rubber, ruler, crayons;
- funds loaded onto the catering account to allow purchase of refreshments at morning break and lunch;
- calculator and maths set including a pair of compasses and protractor;
- filled water bottle with a wide neck which can be re-filled during the day.

On days when PE is timetabled students must ensure that their water bottle is full before the lesson starts, and any student who uses an inhaler should carry one as part of their PE kit.
