Stranger Danger

An incident took place in the south of the city earlier this week. At around 4.30 pm a man attempted to entice a female sixth form student in to his van. He opened the door and she ran away. However, it is a reminder to all students about being vigilant when out and about; beware of being approached by unknown vehicles, avoid travelling alone to and from school and elsewhere, and with the darkening evenings make sure the routes which you travel are well lit.
