Words from the Headteacher

We joined in the festivities of World Book Day for the fourth time yesterday; from fancy dress to literary treasure hunts, the School was occupied with all things bookish. This was on a day when we hosted governor visits to our English and Science departments, having just carried out a scrutiny on Tuesday and Wednesday of our Additional Educational Needs provision led by My Jones and our RET advisers, Nick Kemp and Sue Walker. We rounded off yesterday with the Year 8 subject evening and later on tonight the FoBFS will be running the annual quiz for the fourth year in a row. It's been quite a week!

Over the next fortnight we will be recruiting teaching staff for September 2015. For the next ten school days, teachers wishing to join Bristol Free School will be observed teaching, set a variety of challenges and interviewed for a range of posts at BFS. Not only are we recruiting staff for September to ensure that we are staffed for years 7 to 11 but we are also making sure we have staffing in key areas for our 6th form, opening in September 2016.

Today (Friday 6 March) is the deadline for our Year 9 students to hand in their guided choices forms. I have had the pleasure of interviewing a number of the students and have been extremely impressed with the way in which they are dealing with this important process. They are taking it all very seriously and have demonstrated a keen understanding of the importance of making the right choices during our interviews. Once the deadline passes we will be working on next year's timetable, ensuring that as many of our students as possible are able to take the courses they have selected. Students will receive confirmation of their choices later this term.

Last Friday Miss Exton began her maternity leave and we all wish her well. Miss Collins has joined us as a member of the PE staff for the duration of Miss Exton's maternity leave and I would like to welcome her formally to Bristol Free School.

Friday 13 March is Comic Relief's Red Nose Day and in a similar vein to World Book Day, we will be joining in with the fundraising. Friday 13 March will be a non-uniform day. Students may wear non-school uniform but at least one of the items of clothing worn should be red. As with all of our non-uniform days I expect students to dress appropriately and if any students do not adhere to this expectation they will be sent home to change in to something more appropriate. I have not yet had to carry out this action but nonetheless it is always worth reminding the students of what is and what is not acceptable. One of the themes of Red Nose Day, aside from red items of clothing, is funny faces and we will be running a funny face competition during the day. If we discover that any students have a talent for pulling funny faces then I will be encouraging them to enter the world gurning championships taking place at Egremont Crab Fair in September. However, I am aware of the pressures of coming up with costumes and accessories on days like World Book Day and Red Nose Day so attached to the email sent out with this newsletter is the Comic Relief Red Nose Day Funny Face pack which has plenty of ideas and resources for you to use.
