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STEM Day 2015

After the success of last year's STEM Day, BFS students were treated to a 'Zombie Apocalypse' theme for 2015! Activities were run by Science, ADCT, Humanities and Maths departments and were enjoyed by all.

The Science Department went all out for their 'Infection and Disease Control' session, even donning protective 'biohazard' suits and face masks! The session involved learning about the difference between bacteria and viruses, making 3D



models of a virus, as well as swabbing the classroom for potential 'zombie germs' and learning how quickly and easily disease is spread.

The ADCT Department went for a different spin, and had students designing wearable technology that would be able to detect the threat and onset of the zombie virus!

Humanities investigated the ethics of the situation, looking at testing vaccinations and potential cures on humans of all ages.

Maths mapped the spread of the virus, both geographically and population-wise, to try and investigate if the disease could be contained!
