#### Words from the Headteacher

Thankfully the sun has emerged this week meaning that the requirement not to wear blazers in term 6 makes sense! I am going to repeat the text from the last newsletter of term 5 as a reminder to students as to how they should manage this change in uniform: "From the start of term 6 students will no longer be required to wear blazers in and around school. This annual adjustment to the uniform policy is in recognition of the change in temperature. However, this does not mean that items banned from school on the uniform list are allowed to replace the blazer. Any student wearing these items in and around the school site will have them confiscated and returned at the end of the day. Recidivists will soon find that they have a shrinking wardrobe as their outer layers will be kept for longer than the end of each day."

We have started several new initiatives this term, the first being the launch of our new homework system called "Show My Homework". I hope at the time of reading all parents have received a copy of the letter sent home this week with details about how parents, as well as students, can access the system. Please contact the School if you have not received the letter and we will make sure that you receive your login details. Students are able to log in using their school user name and password. However, they must access "Show My Homework" using the link from the School's website or VLE; if they try to access it straight from Google then they will not be able to log in.

Year 10 is at the centre of two further initiatives, the first following on from the parental consultation about the 6<sup>th</sup> form. Using our VLE, Year 10 students have been completing a Post 16 student survey. The results of this will help us shape the 6th form further with particular weight attached to the students' curriculum preferences which are part of the survey. The second initiative is developing the role of prefect at Bristol Free School. All Year 10 students have been invited to apply for the role of prefect. The prefect system will start in September when Year 10 become Year 11. We are planning a pretty rigorous selection process between now and then and I look forward to welcoming the successful candidates to their new roles later this year.

Four years ago our students started raising money for charity. Since then we have run charity events annually and on an ad-hoc basis, often in response to valid concerns and enterprise from the students. To date the students of Bristol Free School have raised over £4000 for charities ranging from Red Nose Day to Book Aid. Yet again our young people continue to rise to whatever challenges are put before them and long may they continue to do so.
