Words from the Headteacher

Making sure that students are ready for the experience of public exams is vital. For a student it is not solely the exam paper which counts - being comfortable and familiar with the environment in which they sit the exam should not be underestimated. By Friday 26 June every student at BFS will have experienced full exam conditions and be able to call on that experience when sitting their actual public exams be they GCSEs or A Levels. On Monday this week students in KS3 sat exams in the core subjects of English, mathematics and science. Year 9 started the process with Year 7 concluding the KS3 exams yesterday sitting their second paper in Maths. The big changes from previous years were the use of exam invigilators and the hosting of the exams in the Sports Hall. What is routine in other schools is still a novelty at BFS. Late on Friday 5 June, staff laid out the exam equipment transforming the Hall in to BFS's first ever exam hall and our invigilators arrived on Monday to put exam papers out for the very first time. The students in Years 7 to 9 have been superb all of this week and have put down a marker for Year 10 (who begin their exams on Monday 22 June). They lined up in good order, bringing the correct equipment and adhering to public exam conditions. Year 10 will have a fuller programme of exams incorporating English, maths and the sciences as well as their foundation subjects chosen through the pathways process. Once the exams are finished for Year 10 they will be working in small groups through a series of exam surgeries. The outcome of these groups will be a number of subject specific action points which the students will carry with them through to September and Year 11. We may well be a year away from the GCSEs of 2016 but all of the preparation we carry out with the students now will ensure the right conditions for success the following summer; no stone will be left unturned! Organising and orchestrating exams is no mean feat and requires plenty of effort and expertise. Through my years of teaching the organisation of exams has developed in to a fulltime, year-round role. Making sure that you have the right person in post is vital. Bristol Free School is lucky to have Miss Chim, who joined us in September as our Assessment and Exams officer. She has built everything to do with exams from scratch and this last week is evidence of how expert she is at running exams. Our students' exams, be they internal or public, are in very safe hands and I would like to thank Miss Chim and her invigilators formally through this newsletter for getting our exam season off to a flying start.
