## Words from the Headteacher

Year 10 students have just completed the second day of their exam surgeries in preparation for Year 11. We decided prior to the exams to deliver intensive post exam surgeries in English, Maths and Science so that the impact of the summer break on Year 10 students' learning would be reduced and the students are able to start Year 11 with a clear plan of action. The focus on these three subjects is crucial as they are 'facilitator' subjects, providing the gateway in to progression routes beyond GCSEs. Running the surgeries does put additional strain on the rest of the School, increasing demands on cover and asking staff and students to go above and beyond. Nonetheless, the positive impact on each Year 10 student, having dedicated time in which they can identify areas of the curriculum they need to improve, as well as honing exam technique, will be felt beyond the three subjects.

Next week Year 10 students head off to their work experience placements. This is another rite of passage for Bristol Free School and the staff are looking forward to visiting many of our students on their placements. Alongside this work experience, we have two residential trips departing on Monday - a Year 9 History trip to the World War 1 battlefields of France and Belgium and a Year 7 trip to a PGL centre in North Devon. At the end of the week the Modern Foreign Languages team is taking a group of students from Years 8, 9 and 10 to Barcelona.

Thursday next week is the formal start of Aspiration Week. The programme of trips and activities is impressive and the students are in for a treat. We are, however, still waiting on a number of students to return their consent forms. Without those the students cannot attend the off-site visits. Parents and carers, would you please check that your sons and daughters have returned the consent forms. If they haven't then would you make sure that the forms are completed and returned to school as soon as possible? The school office opens at 8.00 am and closes at 4.30 pm, Monday to Friday.
