Words from the Headteacher

Last night's Sixth Form Open Evening was a huge success. There was standing room only in the drama studio with our founding year group and parents in attendance and significant interest from external candidates. We will ensure that our Sixth Form is outstanding; offering a rich and engaging curriculum, an array of extra-curricular opportunities and unrivalled academic and pastoral support. It was fantastic to hear students and parents in animated discussions with members of our curriculum staff, formulating their subject choices with a tangible sense of excitement. This rich level of discussion was down to the expertise of staff and the engagement of students.

The next significant milestone for the Sixth Form is our Sixth Form taster day. This is scheduled for Wednesday 16 December. On this day Year 11 will come to school in sixth form dress, experience a range of sixth form lessons and meet with members of our Sixth Form team, including Mr O'Sullivan who presented at our Open Evening last night.
