On Friday and for the following week we are holding our first annual Art and Design Exhibition. The show features the final pieces and preparatory work from the GCSE groups in Art and DT, encompassing a range of different forms, from portraiture to metalwork. 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Year 10 Mathematicians

On Monday some of the Year 10 mathematicians were treated to a day of maths at Bristol University.

The day started with a session of creative calculations where many of us were left reeling with the realisation that big calculations which had initially looked offputtingly hard could often be solved with very simple techniques which we already knew.

We moved on to hear a talk about the maths behind social networking, then a useful Q and A session and tour of the university with undergraduates. We were challenged by a tricky team quiz, and the day culminated with a mind boggling lecture about Fractal Maths by the renowned mathematician, Katie Steckles.

Some points we were left pondering were: How stunning and yet weird a Mandelbrot

Why a normal cube which is not a fractal shape is 3D, but a cauliflower has a fractal dimension of 2.8?

Why you should never offer to paint the surface area of a fractal shape (you would never finish- it has infinitesimal surface area), but you could fill its volume with paint? How many computer games do we know where coders have used fractals to assimilate a natural looking environment? Gabriel Lombard (Y10)
