Art Trip

On Monday 20 November, the Art department had the wonderful opportunity to be invited to Bristol City Museum for a one off event, to meet the famous potter and TV presenter (from the Great Pottery Throw Down) Kate Malone.

Bristol City Museum closed its doors for the event enabling Kate to share her experiences with the students, drawing upon her own experience of a career spent making things, as well as the practical aspects of the job of a potter. The visit included a look at the Radical Clay exhibition, an activity in the permanent ceramics gallery at the museum and an opportunity to handle some



ceramics from the museum collection with a museum curator. Students were enthused by Kate Malone's inspiring talk and have gained new and exciting ideas to bring back to the classroom.

Launching our RocketFund pitch

After taking part in exciting workshops at PyCon UK, we are using Rocket Fund, a crowd funding site set up to enable schools to purchase technology resources, to raise funds to purchase a set of Raspberry Pis, PiTops and additional accessories. The aim is to allow further development of our Programming Club, including the launch of a Coding Club for Girls in the next 6 months, the ability to host coding competitions and hacks within school as well as for local primary schools and community groups.
