Our Year 11's have approached these additional mocks with a mixture of nerves and cautious optimism. Learning that exam boards don't take headaches, minor sickness or 'having a bad day' into consideration when marking GCSEs is an important part of the preparation process. Those who have revised and prepared well are confident of improvement since November, whilst others know deep down there is still work to do. The most important element of any assessment is to find out where improvements are needed and work on these, an example being James Dyson. Apparently it took him over 5000 attempts to perfect the bag-less vacuum cleaner.

Whilst our Year 11 students won't have over 5000 assessments before their actual GCSEs they may feel as if this is the case. They should not give up if mock results don't go as well as planned, or be over confident if they were better than expected.
