## Match Report—U16 Girls, County Champions

Team BFS looked for another trophy to add to their cabinet this week when the U16 girls football team, already crowned Bristol and South Gloucestershire champions, travelled to Frys Club in Keynsham to face Katherine Lady Berkeley School in the County Cup final. This will be the final time that many of these girls will put on a BFS football jersey, and so the team were determined to finish on a high after an already incredible season.

The midfield pairing of Anna Fraser and Zoe Toye dominated the centre of the park, showing off their range of passing as well as showing some sublime touches. Anna scored two early goals to put Team BFS in the driving seat, but rather than maintain possession and defend their lead, the girls went on the attack for more goals. The KLB defence couldn't handle the exceptional movement of Women of the Match Ellie Preece, drawing in defenders before turning into the space left in behind, providing her with opportunity after opportunity. Ellie finished the game on five goals, and was also brought down in the box after dancing through several defenders before the opposition had no other alternative to stop her scoring her sixth of the game. Sydney Browne stepped up to take the penalty and slotted the ball into the bottom corner.

KLB were looking for their star player to spark life into their performance, a talented footballer who represents Bristol City Ladies, however she came up against a rock in defence in the form of Phoebe Neville. Every tackle, header and second ball was won by Phoebe who always enjoys the challenge of dominating her opposing player. However, KLB showed their fighting spirit and pulled a goal back, giving them a glimmer of hope. Martha Haines made a fantastic save at a crucial point in the game, high to her left which maintained a comfortable lead for Team BFS. Throughout she was protected by a tireless defensive unit, with nothing getting past Hannah Warren, Millie Chaplin and Hazuki Foster. Holly Neville sitting in defensive midfield made tackle after tackle to break up play, halting any rhythm to their attack.

After weathering the storm the BFS girls looked to kill the game off, and Holly Freke delivered one of her trademark shots from wide which flew into the roof of the net, her fourth goal from that position this season. Elisa Saunders and Polly Garton came on to add both energy and quality to the game in the final stages, which were played out with BFS maintaining possession knowing that they will be crowned County Champions at the final whistle, being the first girls football team in the history of BFS to achieve that accolade. The final score finished 9-1 to BFS, a fitting send off for our Y11 students who have always represented the school with such pride and integrity.
