Nepal Expedition

This July, 10 current Year 13 students, 2 teachers (Mr Mitchell and Mrs Jenkins), our expedition leader (Jo) travelled to Nepal for two weeks to visit Singdi school and to experience Nepal.

On 19 July, we arrived in Kathmandu mid-afternoon, feeling very jetlagged (it was night-time back home). We had a few days of sightseeing, buying materials for our project - such as musical instruments, and recovering from the two flights we had taken. Unsurprisingly it was quite a culture shock; adjusting to the loud, vibrant city. Then we had a bumpy bus ride to Besi Sahar where we had curry for lunch (the Nepali staple of Dal Bhat) before travelling the rest of the way by jeep to the village where we would be staying for the night. From there, we did 3 days of trekking through leech-filled jungle and incredible scenery to various Gurung villages before arriving to a huge welcome at Shree Himalaya school in Singdi village. This is a partner school with BFS and also a school that Westbury-on-Trym has very close links with through the Pahar Trust.

Over the 3 days in Singdi, we taught music and science lessons, painted one of the school buildings, and laid the foundation stone for the new canteen. We also enjoyed playing football and cricket with the kids (they were tough competition!) It was really amazing there - with stunning views of the mountains. On our last evening, we were invited to a celebration in the village, with lots of dancing and gift-giving. From there we had one more long day of trekking (about 10 hours in 35 degree heat!) before we stayed in another village called Gilung, which had a great view of the Annapurna range. We then travelled to Pokhara by bus, where we had a quiet evening to do a bit of shopping and to eat some western food (after over a week of Dal Bhat every day). The next day we took another bus to Kathmandu to spend a final evening shopping and sightseeing - we visited the monkey temple, Swayambhunath - before flying home again.

Overall, the trip was an amazing experience for us, despite some ups and downs. We learnt so much about Nepali culture, food and language; improved our teamwork, leadership skills and independence; and made lots of memories. However, we did need a week or so to recover afterwards!

Show My Homework

Hopefully all students have now managed to access SMHW successfully using their school network credentials and are up to date with homework! For those still experiencing difficulties here is a reminder about how to access SMHW...

Students should be logging in to SMHW by clicking the Sign In with Google button and entering school email address and the password they chose for the computers rather than entering school name/username/password. This applies when using the app and the website. If the student is signed into Chrome already, it should log them in automatically. In order for students to submit work online or complete spelling tests, they must be logged into their own account, not their parents.

If students have forgotten their school password, they can ask their computer science teacher to reset it in the lesson or will need to see Mrs Sherman in CG15 after school.

Year 7 students have all been issued with a parental PIN to provide access to SMHW and any existing parents who have forgotten their login details or who have not registered should email admin@bristolfreeschool.org.uk and Mrs Sherman will send a password reset link.
