## #DiversityInLit Conference 2019

"Following the success of last month's student voice session at the Edexcel Pearson headquarters, we headed back to London to join a range of other schools at the #DiversityInLiterature conference.

On arrival we were warmly welcomed once again by Katy Lewis and led into a lavish hall in which the conference was to be held.

Anticipation for what was to come made itself obvious through the smiles on the students faces when, all of a sudden, a bombastic opening of slam poetry on the topic of ambition was delivered to them by a charismatic poet named Solomon O.B; no one could argue that it wasn't a fitting opening to the day.

This was followed by multiple profound and passionate performances by poets of the likes of: Bob Marley inspired Raymond Antrobus; young up and coming Matt Sowerby with poems focusing on the importance of an effective education taking into account students' mental health; Jamila Gavin providing an insightful recollection of how reading aided her when she was young; and an excellent keynote speaker called Ndidi Okezie, Vice President of Secondary portfolio.

The day concluded with a riveting Q&A panel, where students could converse with these accomplished authors on questions they felt were presented to them in the prior presentations. The students asked nuanced questions which invoked thoughtful answers from the speakers and led to an intriguing debate regarding the different facets of modern literature. # Success with Bebras UK Computational Thinking Challenge 2019



We are very pleased to share that Bristol Free School have performed better than ever in the Bebras UK Computational Thinking Challenge, with an amazing 82 students getting through to the follow up competition!

Over 260,000 students competed across the UK with almost 600 from Bristol Free School and the Top 10% are invited to The Oxford Computing Challenge in March organised by the University of Oxford. With more students competing nationally this year, the grade boundaries for a Distinction and Merit also increased and we are incredibly proud of the 192 students who achieved in the Top 25% and the 337 students who achieved in the Top 50%.

The commitment shown to this tough competition and resilience demonstrated by all students throughout has impressed us immensely. Certificates will be distributed to all students who took part in the next few weeks and official invites to the 82 students in the Top 10%. Well done to everyone!
